She completed her Masters in Modern History from the Centre for Historical Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. Subsequently she pursued an MPhil degree titled “Women, Nutrition and Disease, Bengal 1900-1950” from Jadavpur University, Kolkata. She completed her PhD, titled ‘Houses of Madness: “Insane” Women and Asylums in Nineteenth Century Bengal’ from the Centre for Historical Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi in 2012. She has published papers in journals and contributed two chapters to the District Gazetteer of Purba Medinipur on ‘History’ and ‘Medical and Public Health Services’ for the Government of West Bengal. Under the University Grants Commission she completed a project titled “Medical Health and Healing Practices among the Adivasis of Medinipur”. In collaboration with the Santali Department of Vidyasagar University she also completed a project under ICSSR titled “Audio Visual Documentation, Translation and Analysis of Santali Folk Narratives and Performances in Select Districts of West Bengal, Jharkhand and Odisha”. She has been a visiting researcher at the Institute of History of Medicine, Johns Hopkins University.
