17. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary	
<p>The four research centres viz., (i) the Centre for Adivasi Studies and Museum (CASM), (ii) the Centre for Life Sciences, (iii) the Centre for Environmental Studies (CES) and (iv) the Women's Studies Centre (WSC) are offering for multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary Ph.D. degree and training of varied kinds. The CASM caters to the needs of tribal students who want to pursue higher studies and engage in research activities related to the fields of tribal literature, art, and culture. The museum houses rare tribal artefacts. The Centre for Life Sciences is a fully multidisciplinary centre comprising Botany, Zoology, Human Physiology, Microbiology, Bio-medical Laboratory Sciences, Fishery Sciences, etc. departments. The centre organizing several training programs related to biological instruments and courses. The CES has been undertaking activities related to various environmental issues and promoting environmental education, awareness, research and management. The Centre is disseminating adequate knowledge and skills among the researchers through proper training. The CASM has been promoting the issues related to women, feminism, gender and sexuality to support women. The Centre has been encouraging primary and applied research regarding women and development, organizing and assisting training programs for faculties and other women from the society, etc.</p>	
18. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	
<p>The university offers ample scope for Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) to expedite students' mobility across Higher Education institutions. The Credit Bank for students allows students to accumulate credits</p>	

for prior learning experiences. At present the total number of ABC accounts with credit data is more than 3 lakh for undergraduate and postgraduate students. Students are offered the scope of being a part of the ABC by creating their ABC ID by logging into the DigiLocker and going through some simple customised steps. This provision has been made on the university website. Awareness videos released by the apex body of education and administration in India have been uploaded to the university website to encourage students to use this ABC system. Credits awarded to a student for one program from an institution may be transferred/redeemed by another institution upon the student's consent. The university believes that students' credit transfer is the key to successful study mobility.

19.Skill development:

The Computer Centre, National Service Scheme (NSS), University Science Instrumentation Centre (USIC), Office of the Dean of Student Welfare, Sports Department, Fishery Sciences Department, and Language Laboratory actively promote skill development programs for enrolled students and local youth from nearby villages. A notable example is the NSS-led mushroom cultivation training provided to the surrounding community. Each academic department emphasizes skill development alongside theoretical learning; for instance, language departments focus on language and soft skills, while departments like Remote Sensing, Geography, Computer Science, Applied Mathematics, and the Life Sciences Centre are committed to enhancing practical skills among students.

20.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Indian knowledge systems encompass Ayurveda, Yoga, Vedanta, Jyotish, and many more. Although these traditions have been upheld by practitioners over generations, they are yet to be fully integrated into mainstream education and healthcare. One major challenge in achieving this integration is the need for more scientific evidence to substantiate their efficacy. While there is anecdotal and some scientific support for practices like Ayurveda and Yoga, further research is essential to clarify their benefits and limitations. University faculty adapt their teaching to address the diverse linguistic and cultural backgrounds of students from various Indian communities. Language diversity and cultural variety are prioritized during syllabus development. The course content in language and social science departments—especially in Sanskrit, Hindi, English, Bengali, and Santali—demonstrates the university's commitment to incorporating Indian knowledge systems. Additionally, the university offers some online courses in these areas to extend accessibility

and awareness.

21.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Outcome-Based Education (OBE) is an educational model centred on establishing measurable learning outcomes for students and structuring teaching and assessment methods to achieve these outcomes. The goal of OBE is to equip students with the essential knowledge, skills, and competencies they will need for successful careers and personal development. In an OBE system, university faculty and a few administrative officers collaborate to define clear learning outcomes for each course and program. These outcomes specify what students should be able to know, understand, and do after completing their studies, using measurable objectives like "students will be able to explain the scientific method" or "students will be able to solve specific types of problems." Each course in all programs includes defined outcomes. To help students reach these goals, faculty employ diverse teaching methods, including blackboard and PowerPoint lectures, group discussions, field trips, projects, and problem-based learning. Assessment techniques such as class tests, quizzes, assignments, seminars, and presentations are used to gauge student progress. By focusing on skills and competencies, OBE ensures that students are well-prepared for their careers and personal growth.

22.Distance education/online education:

The University's Distance Education program, now known as the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), has been in operation for over 30 years. However, due to not meeting certain criteria required to continue offering CDOE programs, admissions to CDOE courses have been paused. Despite the halt in admissions, the staff and faculty members remain actively employed. Currently, no students are enrolled in these programs, yet we are inputting "1" in relevant fields where data entry does not accept a zero.

Gender Issues:

Addressing gender inequality and advocating for an inclusive society are key commitments. Gender equity is integrated across programs, with courses on Women's Studies, Feminism & Gender Sensitization in various departments. Women's Studies Centre actively promotes gender equity, and subjects like Sociology, Languages, Political Science, explore gender issues and women's empowerment.

In alignment with UGC guidelines, courses on human rights, education rights, and social values are integral to most PG programs. Several departments include subjects like Human Rights, Personality Development, Soft Skills, Yoga, and Life Skills, fostering personal values.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organises special Programmes/ have policies in place for different levels of learners

Primary categorization at the intake level is done through scores at the undergraduate level. The students admitted from the First List of candidates are initially considered as 'Advanced Learners'. The students admitted from the subsequent lists of candidates are initially considered as 'Slow Learners'. The psychometric test is conducted in a month's time after admission to determine the level of receptivity of the students. The first Internal Assessment (after six weeks of beginning of the semester) clearly identifies the Advanced and Slow learners based on their performance. For the slow learners, special tutorial / remedial classes and counselling are offered. One class / week is assigned for the Departmental Library in which the slow learners are guided by the mentors. Various programmes for advanced learners are undertaken through schemes for entry in services, like coaching for SET/ NET/GATE/TOFEL/GRE examinations. For both advanced and slow learners, lectures of experts are regularly arranged, recorded and uploaded in the e-learning portal.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

- The teachers use interactive ppt. forms of presentation. The presentations are prepared keeping in mind the course and topic specific objectives.
- Different departments also practice and promote interactive group discussions among students and scholars.
- Each department have conducted online/offline/hybrid workshop/seminar(s) which has enhanced the learning experiences.
- Almost all programmes have at least one course as field survey or industrial visit in the last semester.
- The Department of English has constructed a digital archive titled Janalipi, based on their findings from field survey of Adivasi life worlds.
- A rich tribal museum, included in the Tourism map of the Government of West Bengal, in the campus provides students with in-house primary resources for study.
- A meteorological park, maintained within the campus provides hands-on experience to students.
- The Biodiversity Atlas of Vidyasagar University Campus records the variety of flora and fauna found in the University campus.
- Learners extend outreach services like community health checkup and children's education to villagers. They design projects to help neighbors so that university and its hinterland grow a sense of reciprocal familiarity between themselves. Inspired by SDG 16, these not only cater to experiential learning but also foster a sense of intimacy and involvement with their learning situation.

2.3.2 - Teachers use ICT enabled tools including online resources for effective teaching and learning processes during the year

The teaching-learning process at Vidyasagar University has been realigned and redefined in the light of recent advances in ICT, to make it easier to implement all types of educational learning theories and delivery models that support and encourage innovative teaching and learning modalities, both for theoretical and lab-based courses.

Post Covid-19 faculties were obliged to learn, implement, and use ICT-enabled tools. The faculty use ICT enabled classrooms with LCD projectors, Wi-Fi connectivity, software, PowerPoint presentations developed by teachers to expose the students to advanced knowledge and practical learning.

The University has a Learning Management System (LMS) that encompasses the majority of the teaching and learning process elements. It includes a variety of content management tools and systems that enable 'anytime, anyplace' access. In addition to the institutional LMS, faculty members can use MOODLE, an open source educational software that has been adapted specifically for teaching-learning infrastructure management and administration.

Also, the university has purchased G-suite through which relevant tools can be used for online teaching. The university has its own official YouTube channel for dissemination of digital contents and live classes.

3.3 - Innovation Ecosystem

3.3.1 - Institution has created an eco-system for innovations including Incubation centre and other initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge

Vidyasagar University fosters a robust ecosystem for innovation, research, and incubation, characterized by state-of-the-art infrastructure and knowledge dissemination. Faculty members, research scholars, and master's students actively engage in cutting-edge research and innovation, including research projects and field visits. The university supports short-term incubation projects for faculty, enabling lab-to-pilot scale preparations and marketing.

To encourage multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary research, the university has established four research centers and departments, alongside an Incubation Centre aimed at skill and entrepreneurship development for both on-campus and nearby rural communities. This center provides essential facilities, managerial support, and training to promote rural entrepreneurship through hands-on demonstrations in areas such as ornamental fish farming, beekeeping, and vermicomposting.

Recent extension activities include hands-on training programs organized by the NSS Unit in adopted villages. In Murakata, a training program on "Vermicomposting: An Eco-friendly Approach for Sustainable Farming" involved 20 participants, while a similar program in Taldanga attracted 40 participants. Additionally, a collaborative project with the Incubation Center is underway to explore the benefits of vermicompost as an organic fertilizer, focusing on improving fish survival rates and water quality.

The anti-ragging cell at the university also educates students about the dangers of ragging.

To support stress management, the university has appointed two psychological counsellors and a permanent medical officer. These professionals are readily available via mobile and WhatsApp to support the mental health of students, teachers, and non-teaching staff. The government provides the necessary funding for these activities, benefiting all stakeholders of the university and the surrounding community.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The institution has adequate facilities for teaching - learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment, etc.

Spread over 138.78 acres, the University features a smart campus and cutting-edge facilities supporting teaching, learning, and administration. The University comprises 82 classrooms, 109 laboratories, 14 seminar halls, ample office space, and various student amenities to support academic, research, training, and extension activities. Among these, 78 classrooms are equipped with ICT tools, including 13 smart and virtual classrooms. The University boasts advanced laboratory equipment such as NMR, Raman, X-ray diffractometer, GC-MS, UV-Vis-NIR, PL, HPLC, TCSPC, DLS, Chemical vapor deposition, and electrochemical workstations, along with desktops, laptops, and servers. University Learning Management System enhances the teaching-learning process, and the fully Wi-Fi enabled campus allows access through smartphones, laptops, and desktops.

The campus is secure, enclosed by boundary walls, and monitored 24/7 by security guards and CCTV cameras. The academic-administrative campus includes all academic departments, the Centre for Distance and Online Education, the Centre for Continuing Adult Education (CCAIE), various interdisciplinary research centres, a library, a computer centre, administrative buildings, canteens, an auditorium, and a sports and cultural complex. These facilities meet the academic and administrative requirements set by statutory bodies such as the UGC and AICTE.

4.1.3 - Availability of general campus facilities and overall ambience

The university integrates seamlessly with nature, boasting lush greenery throughout the campus. Every program begins with the symbolic act of watering a sapling, emphasizing the green ethos. The campus is equipped with ample solar panels and rainwater harvesting systems. Accessibility is prioritized with ramps for the Divyang community and battery-operated vehicles for on-campus transportation.

The university provides residential facilities with separate hostels for male and female students, as well as accommodations for teachers, officers, and non-academic staff. It features two guest houses for VIPs and general visitors. Students enjoy quality food at subsidized rates in the canteens, along with access to transportation, medical services, outdoor and indoor sports facilities, a children's park, and an amenities centre.

The university operates a community radio station, Betar Vidyasagar, on FM 90.8 and internet radio; broadcasting academic and cultural events, research updates, health-related awareness programs, PM-PRANAM schemes, news, and weather reports. It also has a power sub-station with 24/7 backup via DG sets, WiFi, CCTV surveillance, and a fire safety system.

The state-of-the-art auditorium, Vivekananda Sabhagriha, seats over 1,000 people. Additionally, there are banking facilities, ATMs, and a post office on campus, ensuring convenience for all residents.

4.2 - Library as a Learning Resource

4.2.1 - Library is automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) and has digitisation facility

Library resources and services underwent automation in 2018 with the implementation of the library automation software "KOHA." Prior to this, from 2001, library automation utilized "SOUL 1.0," which was subsequently upgraded to "SOUL 2.0" in 2017. To enhance user experience, the Central Library introduced RFID technology, facilitating self-check in/out kiosks equipped with RFID readers and capacitive touch screens. These kiosks are integrated with the Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) via the SIP2 protocol. RFID technology also ensures security through Electronic Article Surveillance (EAS) gates utilizing EA security bit features on the TAGs.

Library patrons are accustomed to utilizing self-service kiosks located on the Ground Floor of the Library. Access to the Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC) and other library resources is facilitated through the Library Portal, accessible via the university website. The Library Portal offers access to an extensive range of e-resources, including electronic books subscribed by the university. Full-text electronic resources, accessible via PCs, laptops, and other electronic devices connected to the campus network, are available to researchers and faculty members through Remote Access Facility.

The present ILMS software, KOHA, is fully automated, with the current version being 18.11.08.000. The library's ICT infrastructure serves educational, research, and e-governance purposes. Additionally, the library houses the Centre for Digital Resources

The university boasts a cutting-edge smart campus with advanced ICT infrastructure and services, continuously updated according to the "Vidyasagar University IT POLICY, Rules and Regulations 2.0." The campus features approximately 10 servers, 2 mini data centers with virtual computing, 1173 desktops, 205 laptops, 35 VoIP devices, 128 IP CCTV cameras, 5 NVR, 12 biometric devices, video conferencing equipment, and digital notice boards. These IT resources are interconnected via a campus-wide LAN and Wi-Fi network. The

university enjoys 1Gbps NKN internet connectivity.

The university employs a biometric attendance system and a Leave/HR Management System for all employees. It has a dedicated software development cell that caters to regular and new application software needs, developing various e-governance modules on demand.

The physical IT infrastructure and facilities are regularly updated and upgraded as needed. Desktops and peripheral devices are replaced with new purchases as they become obsolete. The campus LAN and Wi-Fi are consistently expanded and upgraded, maintained centrally by the Computer Centre. The university's IT budget for the year 2022-23 is ₹1.516 crore.

- The University's maintenance committee oversees the upkeep of buildings, classrooms, and laboratories, conducting regular inspections to ensure infrastructure efficiency.
- The campus employs an adequate in-house staff dedicated to maintaining hygiene, cleanliness, and overall infrastructure. A full-time gardener manages the campus's green cover.
- To ensure all equipment and facilities are in optimal working condition, the University relies on annual maintenance contracts (AMC). These contracts cover a wide range of assets, including generators, air conditioners, ICT infrastructure (such as IT gadgets, campus LAN, Wi-Fi, digital accessories), CCTV cameras, and water purifiers.
- The Computer Centre, adhering to the University's IT policy, maintains all ICT infrastructure. In addition to contract workers, the University has trained in-house electricians and plumbers.
- Parking facilities are well-organized, and surveillance cameras monitor campus maintenance activities. The maintenance team rigorously maintains and verifies stock registers for all equipment.
- The maintenance department conducts annual pest control for library books and records. Additionally, the Senior University Engineer and their team oversee the regular maintenance of civil and electrical works across the campus.
- The University's sports facilities are meticulously maintained under the supervision of the Sports Committee, which operates under the Advisory Committee of the Sports Board. Separate gyms for boys and girls are maintained through Annual Maintenance Contracts (AMC). Two dedicated groundsmen oversee the health and upkeep of the sports grounds year-round, ensuring they are ready for state and national-level sports events.

Key governing bodies, including the Court, Executive Council (EC), Faculty Council for Post Graduate Studies, Board of Studies, and Departmental Committees, each have specific statutory roles and functions. The Court serves as the apex body, ratifying major academic and administrative decisions presented during EC meetings.

The governing body consists of elected and nominated members representing all stakeholders, including faculty and non-teaching staff from the university and affiliated colleges, college principals, and government officials, as well as special invitees.

The Faculty Council for Post Graduate Studies includes the heads of all academic departments and senior professors, ensuring

comprehensive representation. Departmental Committees play a vital role in managing daily departmental activities, while the Board of Studies (both UG and PG) is crucial for academic governance, preparing lists of paper setters, examiners, and moderators for examination processes.

Additionally, the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) fosters dignity and self-respect among stakeholders, addressing gender discrimination and promoting sensitization. Representatives from the Teachers Association and Non-teaching Staff participate in important committees, and alumni and industry representatives contribute to syllabus formulation. Students are also included in various committees, such as the ICC and the NSS.

Teaching-Learning and Evaluation

Vidyasagar University is committed to delivering high-quality education for postgraduate and doctoral programs. It strictly follows an academic calendar that outlines essential activities such as compulsory classroom teaching, tutorials, continuous internal assessments, and end-semester examinations. Each student has a Research Advisory Committee (RAC) that periodically evaluates their research progress, ensuring a structured approach to academic growth.

Research and Development

Faculty members are encouraged to engage in Faculty Development Programs (FDPs), workshops, seminars, and conferences, enhancing their professional development. They actively share research findings at national and international forums, with publications in SCOPUS and WoS indexed journals. The university also supports the

submission of project proposals to various funding agencies and the university publishes UGC Care-listed journals, newsletters, and wall magazines.

Green Initiatives on Campus

Vidyasagar University emphasizes sustainability through various green initiatives. Collaborating with the NSS cell, it promotes a plastic-free campus and observes Forest Week for environmental awareness. There is a tradition of watering newly planted trees during ceremonies, and outside vehicle entry is limited once a week to reduce air pollution. The university maintains natural water bodies, ensures effective waste management and wastewater recycling, and designates feeding areas for local wildlife on campus.

Moreover, the University receives limited funds from various funding agencies like Central government, State government, RUSA, UGC, DST, DBT, TEQIP etc.

Optimal utilization of resources:

1. Purchases above Rs. 5 lakh will be decided in the Central Purchase Committee.

2. For direct purchases without any tender/quotation by the Pl/Coordinator, the existing ceiling limit of Rs.10,000/- is increased to Rs. 25,000/- for other than State Government or University funding.

3. Various committees like Technical Committee, Purchase Committee, Sales Committee, Finance Committee, Executive Council etc. are constituted to make policies, take decisions and accord sanctions for effective utilization of funds.

6.5.1 - Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes by constantly reviewing the teaching learning process, structures & methodologies of operations and learning outcomes at periodic intervals

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) at Vidyasagar University has been proactive in enhancing the educational experience. It monitored syllabus completion during even semesters by distributing a standardized format to departments, which documented the total classes allotted, classes conducted, and percentage of syllabus completed. Heads of Departments submitted relevant documents at semester's end.

Additionally, the IQAC tracked course-specific and program-specific outcomes to ensure alignment with educational goals. Attendance was jointly monitored with the Secretary of the PG Councils, fostering accountability among students.

Under the IQAC's guidance, e-contents for postgraduate courses were developed, including 50 video lectures of 30 minutes each uploaded to the university's site. The IQAC also led the revision of the PG syllabus, incorporating UGC guidelines that emphasized gender, environment, professional ethics, and values. Syllabus revision committees comprised PG faculty, alumni, and external experts.

Furthermore, the IQAC organized various capacity-building programs, including orientation sessions for research scholars and workshops on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) and soft skills development in Computer Applications for Business. Detailed records of seminars and workshops held throughout the year are maintained at the IQAC office, reflecting its commitment to continuous improvement in academic quality.

Each road with in the campus are covered with avenue plants. Some unique animals like porcupine and tortoises are also observed in the campus.

Lateritic soil and slope towards north east make some natural depressions. During rainy sessions this area are filled with of water.

The meteorological park set up in the university acts as a unique Centre for lending weather related data to local farmers, agriculturists and oceanographic researchers.

The University started developing beverages like jam, jelly and honey in natural processes. Also the University taking iniatiative for Bee hives are maintained.

The cashew nut trees in the campus are leased out for generation of financial resources.

The rich flora of the campus promotes pollination and bio-diversity.
