Concept Note: As South Asia was connected to the world capitalist economy in the 19th century, major changes took place in society, not only on the basis of class but also in other social categories, such as caste and gender. Social and cultural relationships were constantly renegotiated and changing. Colonial and post-colonial states became a tool and spatial location of modernity. In recent South Asian historiography, some of the questions revolve around the issues like rethinking territory, periodization, and temporality. In the background of space time question, the question of modernity is also placed. There is also a renewed interest in studying tradition and vernacular histories located in pre-colonial times. Recognizing society, culture and identity in South Asia as primordial categories, new scholarships have moved beyond the homogeneous representations of caste, religion, gender, or nation to foreground plurality, negotiations, contestation and lived experiences. The shift has emerged as a critical lens through which historians now reconstruct both colonial and postcolonial South Asia beyond the context of so-called tradition-modernity binaries. This seminar will engage with these new, interesting and changing histories of South Asia through interdisciplinary and comparative approaches.
