Message From The Vice-Chancellor



It is my pleasure to welcome you to Vidyasagar University which was created as a State University in 1981. Since then, the institution has been flourishing rapidly. The academic journey of the University was initiated on a modest scale in the year 1986 with six Postgraduate departments. The University now conducts studies in the new frontier and interdisciplinary areas of science, social science, humanities and commerce, spread across twenty seven Postgraduate Departments. The University is proud of its highly qualified and dedicated faculty members, motivated students and research scholars demonstrating innovative research skills, adequately equipped with administrative staffs that are capable of assimilating the forces of modernization and globalization in the field of higher education.

The University is named after Pandit Iswarchandra Vidya Sagar, the legendary 19th century pioneering social reformer, social activist, litterateur who was dedicated to the cause of the upliftment of the women. Since its inception, the University has committed itself to the gamut of teaching and learning in higher education, with the prime objective of rendering value based quality education and providing research and extracurricular activities in the best possible manner. All those efforts have been for spreading alongside the benefit of higher education in an environmentally challenged location (drought prone, lateritic soil, degraded forest and extreme climatic condition) inhabited mostly by poor and marginalized peoples of the society but which has a glorious history of playing a lead role in the freedom struggle of India. The University has registered its growth both qualitatively and quantitatively in terms of academic development, research outcomes and societal interactive process. Postgraduate studies are conducted not only in 30 departments/Centres (20 Science subjects and 16 Arts & Commerce including 5 Language subjects) of the University but also in 34 colleges/institutions as well. The subjects offered in the undergraduate colleges cover the traditional subjects as well as modern emerging ones. A few professional colleges providing courses in management and social work also belong to this University circuit. The University is having 59 affiliated Colleges of which 8 Colleges have been accredited with 'A' Grade by NAAC. The University also boasts of its 5 Inter-disciplinary Centres namely *Centre for Adivasi Studies and Museum*, *Centre for Environmental Studies*, *Centre for Life Sciences*, *Women's Studies Centre* and *Gandhian Studies Centre*. In order to boost up the morale of Researchers including the faculty members of different leading Postgraduate colleges, several Research Centres have been granted by the University under the direct supervision of the Research Monitoring Committees constituted by the Vice Chancellor. Such Research Centers were started in the Midnapore (Autonomous) College, Raja N. L. Khan Women's College (Autonomous), Panskura Banamali College (Autonomous), Tamralipta Mahavidyalaya, Contai P.K. College, Mugberia Gangadhar Mahavidyalaya, Haldia Government College, Jhargram Raj College, Mahisadal Raj College, etc. Different Add on courses and skill

development courses like *Personality Development, Artificial Intelligence, Scientific Documentation using LaTex, Communicative English, Human Rights and its Applications, Wildlife Ecology & Conservation* etc. have also been started in different postgraduate departments. Apart from this, a 6-month Diploma Course programme on *Public Health Management* has been initiated by the University exclusively for the Defence Personnel. Till date, 16 numbers of MOUs and have been signed with acclaimed national and international institutions for encouragement and development of cooperation and exchange in areas of mutual academic and research interest and to enhance research and educational processes.

The Vidyasagar University has a mission to contribute to society at the highest levels of excellence, through the pursuit of education, generation of knowledge and facilitating societal progress. Each of the three elements of our mission should be valued, and we strive to ensure that they are. We pass knowledge to the next generation, and store it for generations to come. We champion enlightened and rational thought and we articulate the values of humanity. The thrill for all of us at this University is that every single day is a day in which we contribute to changing lives for the better.

Vidyasagar University has a beautiful sprawling and eco-friendly plastic-free campus which houses administrative departments, post-graduate departments for teaching, learning and research, a Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), expanding hostel buildings for both male and female students, residential accommodation for both teaching and administrative staffs, a sports complex, a student amenity Centre and Extension Centres etc. The University now boasts of being one of the first smart campuses in West Bengal. In consonance with its vision to be a centre of excellence in the areas of teaching and research and other kind of academic activities, Vidyasagar University's academic structure and Aims and Objectives had been so designed to enhance students' ability to become highly competent professionals and global players of the future. In the course of these developments, however, we have not allowed our ecological concerns to take a back-seat for a moment.

The overall achievements of our University during its onward journey enunciating around 40 years back have promoted the University stakeholders to become more confident and determined to promote the spirit of progress in the academic circle of West Bengal and spread the message of quality and human friendly education to other parts of the Country. But this is not the end, it is rather a beginning and we have to undertake hard work and concerted efforts as a Team to achieve bigger goals both in the field of higher education and social reconstruction. Such committed and determined commitments are expected to make Vidyasagar University as one of the pioneering Universities not only in the field of academic and administrative activities but also as a centre of innovative ideas in Teaching, Research and Development.

The faculty members of this University have put in outstanding effort in blending quality research with pedagogic skill. They have made full use of the smart class rooms and have pulled in a substantial amount of research funding through the year. Faculties of several departments were felicitated with awards in recognition of their contribution to teaching and research. Their research endeavours have attracted significant grants from funding agencies for the development of pedagogic and research infrastructure in the campus. The teachers earned international and national recognitions by virtue of their research findings, which have been reflected in their high quality research publications and completed research projects. Our teachers have been granted international and national patents, travelled far and wide on their academic tours to different parts of the world and two faculties have earned rare distinctions by their inclusion among the world's best scientists.


The entire community of Vidyasagar University is very much concerned about maintaining the ecological health of the campus which have been reflected to convert a huge chunk of waste land of about 200 acres at the very beginning of the University to a 'Green Belt' with the passage of time, with very little emission of atmospheric pollutants, alongside promoting several Green Technology based activities like bioconversion of solid wastes into organic fertilizers, promoting the propagation of pollinators alongside harvesting honey, production of mushroom culture, aquaculture, rain water harvesting, installation of solar panels, maintenance of orchards, maintenance of animal feeding sites etc. The University has been able to convert a chunk of 10 acres of open wasteland within the Vidyasagar University campus into a productive green belt by developing an Orchard, named as *Prokrito* by planting more than 500 fruit trees (Mango, Amla, Lemon, Gauava etc.) and a Flower garden, named as *Parijat* by planting more than 200 perennial flower plants like Champa, Parijat, Shiuli, Hibiscous, Mosaunda etc., under the aegis of Vidyasagar University Nature Club.

Apart from the Wi-Fi enabled Smart Campus with free internet, Vidyasagar University now boasts of 13 audio-visual Smart e-Class Rooms, RFID based Wi-Fi enabled Library, PWD compliant campus with assistive technologies, Ragging Free campus, scheduled Bus service and shuttle Car service, Placement Cell and Stress Management Cell, Modern Garbage Disposal System in the campus and Subsidized Meals to the postgraduate students. The only institutional setup for academic research on tribal culture and literature within the varsity system of this state is now located in our campus as an interdisciplinary *Centre for Adivasi Studies*. It maintains an *Adivasi Museum* as part of its archival project. Another feather in the cap of Vidyasagar University is the installation of a Sensor Based Continuous Air Quality & Real-time Noise Level Monitoring machine by the West Bengal Pollution Control Board, the first to have been installed by them in West Bengal. It is worthy to mention that the Cine Club of Vidyasagar University has been rejuvenated and has started screening quality films for Film education and entertainment of one and all. Beside this, a two-storied Humanities Building has also been built and will be made operational shortly. There is also a Psychological Counseling Centre for the students. Arrangements for coaching for the aspirants of Civil Services Examination have also been arranged by the University. We have also participated in the disaster management programme of the State Government in the wake of the ravages left behind by the devastating cyclones.

As the Vice-Chancellor of this University, I shall try my best to consolidate our strength more judiciously with the aim at achieving a model University Management System by inculcating value based holistic and integrated approaches so that the needs of the students are satisfied and expectations of the society are fulfilled.

A) ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Vidyasagar University started its academic activities during the Seventh Plan Period (1985) from the session 1985-1986, following an Act of the State Assembly, to cater to the needs of higher education with special emphasis on the all-round development of the rural areas of the agro-based districts of Midnapore. The geographical area covered by this University is quite under-developed and that demands special attention on human resource development to improve the socio-economic condition of the people of this region. The Courses offered by the University have been designed with that end in mind.

The University began its journey with six Post-Graduate Departments under Arts, Commerce and Science Faculties from the session 1985-1986, and each course was designed to lay special stress on regional needs. Subsequently, in 1989 & 1990, nine more PG Courses were added and special attention and weightage were duly given to the needs of the region, keeping in mind the environmental requirements like Forestry and Fisheries as well as Health and Nutritional needs of the people, besides the technological requirements for industrial development in the region. B) APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Candidates are required to fill in the Application Form only through **online portal**(<https://eadmission.vidyasagar.ac.in>). The applicants have to fill in the form with their personal details and academic details, and they have to upload the scanned copy(s) of all the Marksheets&Certificates, along with their photo and signature to the admission portal. **No Application Fee Is Being Charged By The University.**

The applicants have to fill in the forms for admission to Post-Graduate &B.L.I.Sc programmes, as described in the Eligibility criteria under Section C. The applicants will have to fill in the equivalent percentage of marks corresponding to their CGPA obtained, as described in Section E, as per the rule fixed by their home institution. Candidates have to upload the relevant documents showing the official conversion rule (on the reverse side of the marksheets if the conversion rule for CGPA to equivalent percentage is mentioned. Otherwise, candidates have to upload the official conversion rule for the same along with their marksheets). All the candidates have to produce all the original marksheets, certificates and identity proof at the time of physical verification.

Candidates are advised to note that this online application is only for admission to PG programmes in Vidyasagar University and its Affiliated Colleges. For admission to PG programmes in Autonomous Colleges and Private Colleges, candidates are advised to follow the website of the respective college(s) for more information regarding admissions to the PG programmes.

C) ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO POST-GRADUATE & B.L.I.SC PROGRAMMES (including PG Programmes running under CCAE) IN VIDYASAGAR UNIVERSITY AND AFFILIATED COLLEGES

**E) ADMISSION PROCESS FLOW AND GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION TO
PG & B.L.I.Sc. PROGRAMMES IN VIDYASAGAR UNIVERSITY AND
AFFILIATED COLLEGES**

[The merit lists will be prepared based on the marks obtained in the previous examinations such as UG, 10+2, etc.]

1. Merit List (80% category) for the students of Vidyasagar University (VU) [including Autonomous colleges]

1.1. For the admission of the Vidyasagar University (VU) students (including Autonomous Colleges) under 80% category, the merit list will be prepared on the basis of: -

- (a) UG (Hons) final percentage of marks (Part-I, Part-II & Part-III taking together) in case of annual system. OR
- (b) UG (Hons) equivalent percentage of marks converted from CGPA, in case of semester (CBCS) system.

1.2. In case of a **tie**, marks obtained in the immediately preceding examinations are to be considered for ranking.

1.3 **Reservation policy will be considered as per orders issued by the Govt. of West Bengal, as may be applicable from time to time. Reservation policy for OBC category will be guided by the solemn order of the Hon'ble Court.**

1.4 **Only candidates permanently residing within the state of West Bengal will be eligible for availing reservation.**

1.5 **5% of each category (Unreserved and Reserved)** will be reserved for **PWD** candidates. Merit list will be prepared on the percentage of disability. In case of non-availability of **PWD** candidates, the seats reserved for **PWD** candidates of the particular category will be converted to that Category only.

1.6 1% of total seats of each PG Programme are reserved for candidates applying under Sports/ Culture quota.

1.7 Prize holders at International/National/State representation in the last two years will be considered for Sports Quota, provided that he/she is a prize holder in the Inter College Competition/ Inter College Athletic Meet organized by our university in his/her tenure in UG level. The sports events are Football, Volleyball, Athletic, Yoga, Kho-kho, Kabaddi, Chess and Table Tennis. A committee will be constituted to assess the performance of the applicants in the respective field.

1.8 Prize holders in the International/National/State meets in the last two years will be considered for Cultural Quota, provided that he/she is a prize holder in the Inter College Cultural Competition organized by our university in his/her tenure in UG level. A committee will be constituted to assess the performance of the applicants in the respective field.

1.9 The number of seats in the particular subjects will be reduced by the number of candidates selected for Sports/Culture Quota in that subject. The number of seats will be reduced from the particular category (UR/EWS/SC/ST/OBC) in which he/she belongs.

1.10 Any candidate who has studied under Vidyasagar University in the past, and has drawn a Migration Certificate from the university, will be ineligible for the 80% category. They will have to mandatorily apply under the 20% category.

2. *Merit List for Other University students (20% Category:20% of total seats):*

2.1. For the admission of students from Other Universities under 20% category, the merit list will be prepared on the basis of:

- (a) UG (Hons) final percentage of marks (Part-I, Part-II & Part-III taking together) in case of annual system. OR
- (b) UG (Hons) equivalent percentage of marks converted from CGPA, in case of semester (CBCS) system.

2.2. In case of a **tie**, marks obtained in the immediately preceding examinations are to be considered for ranking.

2.3 Reservation policy will be considered as per orders issued by the Govt. of West Bengal, as may be applicable from time to time. Reservation policy for OBC and OBC category will be guided by the solemn order of the Hon'ble Court.

2.4 Only candidates permanently residing within the state of West Bengal will be eligible for availing reservation.

2.5 5% of each category (Unreserved and Reserved) will be reserved for PWD candidates. Merit list will be prepared on the percentage of disability. In case of non-availability of PWD candidates, the seats reserved for PWD candidates of the particular category will be converted to that Category only.

2.6 Any candidate who has studied under Vidyasagar University in the past, and has drawn a Migration Certificate from the university, will be ineligible for the 80% category. They will have to mandatorily apply under the 20% category.

3. *Other essential information: -*

- i) Online provisional admission will be done through the university admission portal.
- ii) The verification of testimonials & other documents for provisionally admitted students will be initiated after commencement of classes.
- iii) The verification will be held in the concerned department. The faculty members of the concerned departments will be present at the time of verification.

- iv) The affiliated colleges affiliated to Vidyasagar University will follow the Rules and Regulations regarding admission to PG Programmes framed by Vidyasagar University and the Government of West Bengal.
- v) **Admission to PG Programmes in autonomous and Private colleges shall be conducted by the individual colleges by following the same rules as for the university.**
- vi) The admission will be cancelled if a student remains absent from classes for ten (10) consecutive days from the date of commencement of classes without any intimation to the concerned Head / Secretary, Faculty Councils for PG Studies / Principal or Teacher-in-Charge of the concerned college, and the admission fees paid will be refunded as per latest UGC Guidelines.
- vii) If any candidate shifts to another institution without intimation to the university within ten days from the date of commencement of classes, the admission fees paid will be refunded as per latest UGC Guidelines.
- viii) Applicants are to follow the notices on the website of Vidyasagar University all the time. No intimation of any kind will be sent to the individual at any stage.
- ix) For admission to different PG programmes, the criteria for minimum marks required for reserved categories will be followed as per the order of Govt. of West Bengal. **Only candidates permanently residing within the state of West Bengal will be eligible for availing reservation.**
- x) **All the provisionally admitted applicants are required to be present in their allotted institution on the specified date and to produce all the originals of uploaded Certificates, Mark Sheets and testimonials at the time of physical verification of admission.** The final semester marksheet should be produced at the time of Verification. In case an applicant cannot produce the final semester marksheet at the time of verification, he/she will be required to produce it **within fifteen days**, failing which the applicant's candidature will be liable to be cancelled.
- xi) The physical verification of testimonials & other documents for provisionally admitted students will be held in the concerned departments/institutions by the appropriate bodies when students will be asked to report for their offline classes in the Campus.
- xii) **The student will not indulge in any act of ragging. If he/she is found guilty of any aspect of ragging, he/she will be punished as per provisions of the UGC regulations and/or as per law in force.**

- xiii) **Application forms, if not properly filled-in and accompanied by attested copies of the documents, are liable for cancellation.**
- xiv) **Admission will be cancelled if the original documents are not found in conformity with the declaration in the forms submitted online.**
- xv) **If, at any stage, it is found that a candidate has concealed, suppressed or distorted any information/fact in the application form, his/her admission to the university shall be summarily cancelled.**
- xvi) The admitted students are to attend at least 75% of the total classes held in all Semesters; otherwise, he/she will not be allowed to fill in his/her form for examination.
- xvii) In addition to the semester fees, the following fees will be charged per semester: -
 - a) Computer Skills Development Fees – 50/-
 - b) Communicative English Training Fees – 50/-
 - c) Social Service Fees – 25/-
- xviii) The students of other universities, including **candidates who have studied under Vidyasagar University in the past, and have drawn Migration Certificates from the university**, who will get admitted, have to submit the ‘Migration Certificate’ **within two months from the date of admission**, failing which they will not be allowed to appear at the final examination of the Semester-I.
- xix) Two seats under Supernumerary Quota will be made available to the students of Jammu & Kashmir who seek admission.

4. Calculation of HS Percentage

Percentage (%) of marks will be calculated on the basis of marks in Top 5 subjects obtained in aggregate.

5. Calculation Of UG and PG Percentage of Marks

- (a) In case of annual system, percentage (%) of marks will be calculated on the basis of UG (Hons) marks obtained in aggregate (Part-I, Part-II & Part-III taken together), and PG marks obtained in aggregate (Part-I and Part-II taken together).
- (b) In case of semester (CBCS) system, UG (Hons) equivalent percentage of marks will be converted from CGPA, based on all semesters (Semester-I to Semester-VI), or PG equivalent percentage of marks will be converted from CGPA, based on all semesters (Semester-I to Semester-IV), as per the rule fixed by their respective home institution.

(i) For the Vidyasagar University Semester system (CBCS):

Let, CGPA = 7.1, The equivalent percentage of marks for Vidyasagar University students (as per conversion rule of Vidyasagar University) = $7.1 \times 10 = 71$

(ii) For other institutions with semester system (CBCS):

Similarly, for the students of other Universities/Institutions and Autonomous Colleges affiliated to Vidyasagar University, the percentage of marks will be calculated as per the percentage conversion rule fixed by their home University / Institution and Colleges.

6. Conversion of seats:

1. For PG programmes, as per the orders issued by the Govt. of West Bengal.

2. For B.L.I.Sc Programme

- a) If **UG (Hons) students of UR category** is/are unavailable, the seat will be filled in by the **PG [with UG(Hons)] student of UR category** and vice-versa
- b) If **UG (Hons) student of a particular reserved category** is unavailable, the seat will be filled in by the **PG [with UG(Hons)] of that particular reserved category** and vice-versa
- c) If both UG (Hons) and PG [with UG(Hons)] students of that particular reserved category is/are unavailable, then it will be filled in as follows:
 - (i) If the seat is originally UG (SC) category it will be converted to UG (ST) and vice-versa, even then if the seat remains vacant, rule (b) will come into effect.
 - (ii) If seat is originally PG (SC) category it will be converted to PG (ST) and vice-versa, even then if the seat remains vacant, rule (b) will come into effect.
 - (iii) Similarly rule c (i& ii) will be applied for the other reserved category.
- (d) If DA candidate is unavailable, the seat will be converted to PG (UR) category.

INFORMATION REGARDING THE UNIVERSITY

Hostel Accommodation:

There are five Hostels – two for Boys and three for Girls- in the University campus. The Boys' Hostel and Girls' Hostels accommodate 291 students and 393 students respectively. Hostel accommodation is provided to select students depending on the distance between their place of residence and Vidyasagar University, as well as academic performance and family income. - **Short-term training programmes** in various branches of Life Sciences, held regularly to enhance skill development and promote scientific curiosity among students and researchers.

The *Centre for Life Sciences* remains dedicated to advancing knowledge, fostering innovation, and contributing meaningfully to society through **research, education, and outreach**.

Women's Studies Centre

Objectives:

The Women's Studies Centre aims to promote study, research, documentation & publications, training and consultancy, on issues related to women with an objective to support women from all strata of society, especially from rural South-Bengal, to enhance and encourage their potentials for sustenance and contribution to the National Development. The Centre provides interdisciplinary opportunities for research and allied activities on a wide range of Women's issues.

Ph.D Programme in Women's Studies:

The Ph.D programme in Women's Studies (w.e.f. the session 2019-20) enhances and nourishes the research potentials of scholars who carry out research in the domain of women's studies. Any candidate with either Social Science or Humanities background may join the programme, following extant university norms.

Diploma in Social Work:

The course has started from the academic session 2024-2025. It is a one year/two semesters course, the outcome of which includes employability in projects/organisations related to social work/welfare. The course includes classroom teaching/field work/project writing/communicative skill development. The eligibility criterion for the course is graduation in any discipline/subject.

Centre for Environmental Studies (CES)

About the Centre:

The Centre for Environmental Studies (CES) is an interdisciplinary centre for research and education in Environmental Studies including environmental history and environmental humanities. The Centre was founded in 2018 by the Vidyasagar University to undertake activities related to various environmental issues, promote Environmental Education and Awareness, Research and Management. The Centre will meet its mission by fostering and supporting collaborative research programmes, developing and

maintaining the state of the art facilities for research and facilitate the development and implementation of multi-disciplinary research programmes in the field of Environmental Studies. Owing to its inherent interdisciplinary nature the centre will be run with the academic inputs from resource persons of diverse disciplines from within Vidyasagar University and also various universities and institutes in India and abroad.

Aims:

The Centre has been established to conduct research and produce interdisciplinary knowledge as an integral part of its programmes. It will offer different certificate, diploma and degree courses related to various fields of Environmental Studies for students, research scholars, working professionals and other interested persons with the view of widening their knowledge and skills and to make them suitable for today's competitive employment-market. It also aims to open a fruitful dialogue between Environmental Science and Environmental Humanities by fostering research in cross-disciplinary areas. The major objective of the centre will be to formulate research strategies required for the development of the emerging and enlarging areas of environmental studies by undertaking research projects on various themes of the thrust area including History of Conservation and Management of Nature, State Policy and the Natural World. Also included are the Intellectual History of Environmental Ideas in India and building up of necessary research tools for opening up new pertinent queries. The research projects of the centre would contextualize and historicize the diverse issues within the framework of global environmentalism, the present environmental debate and the ongoing concern with global warming faced by the human society today. The aim of the centre is to capture existing conjunctures across environmental philosophy, environmental history, eco-criticism, cultural geography, cultural anthropology, and political ecology and also seek to integrate debates so far largely shaped by different disciplinary contexts.

Mission:

The Centre for Environmental Studies (CES) seeks to increase the understanding of current environmental issues. The objective of the centre is to disseminate adequate knowledge and skill among the researchers through proper training, survey and exposure to environmental issues in today's world. The students will also be trained in all aspects of environment management and cutting-edge technology in order to enhance their knowledge to address the recent environmental problems and management of these issues in a professional manner. (The emerging requirement for environment-conservation professionals shall be met by those trained by the Centre)

Programmes:

Ph.D

The PhD in Environmental Studies is one of the most diverse doctoral programmes exploring environmental concerns. Adopting an interdisciplinary approach to environmental research, it connects conventional disciplines such as social sciences, humanities, arts, and natural sciences and several others in ways that encourage viewing issues through a broader, more contextual perspective.

This programme has three overarching aims

- To examine the nature, causes and impacts of major types of environmental change. How do these changes operate and interact on global, regional and local scales? How do they relate to critical social and ecological systems?
- To examine the economic, legal, cultural, and ethical underpinnings of environmental responsibility and systemic solutions, including mitigation, adaptation, remediation, enhanced resource stewardship and other sustainable responses to environmental change at different scales and within different organizational contexts; and
- To empower environmental leaders to address the world's most pressing environmental problems through an understanding of and training in the key analytical and practical skills, and in a broad appreciation of earth systems and societies in relation to environmental change.

Centre for Adivasi Studies and Museum

About the Centre:

Vidyasagar University is located in a socio-economically backward district of West Bengal. A substantial number of students of the University belong to the socio-economically disadvantaged groups, mainly the adivasi communities like Santal, Bhumij, Lodha, Munda, Shabar, Kora, Ho, Birhor etc. This Centre specially caters to the needs of the adivasi students who want to pursue higher studies and engage in research activities related to the fields including tribal literature, art and culture. The museum houses rare tribal artefacts that are objects of particular academic interests for scholars pursuing research in cultural studies and anthropology. The non-tribal students derive benefit from this centre by studying in the fields of Adivasi literature and culture and other allied disciplines along with the tribal students. Thus, the centre provides a space for an intimate exchange between different

forms of cultures – the so-called mainstream and the marginal, and resists the privileging of the former over the latter.

Vision:

The Adivasi Studies is no longer an ‘other’ in the domain of academic research. At present, it is a field of much interest to the academicians all over the world. The Centre for Adivasi Studies and Museum (CASM) at Vidyasagar University offers higher studies and awards degrees and certificates in the related field. From the academic year 2019-20 it has started offering three courses: Certificate Course in Museum Studies; M.Phil. and Ph.D programmes in Adivasi Studies. At present the CASM runs Ph.D. programme in Adivasi Studies. The Centre regularly organizes conferences/workshops to spread new ideas in the field of Adivasi Studies. The centre invites experts from different parts of the country and beyond to shape the future course of Adivasi Studies. The centre has recently collaborated with Institute of Ethnology and Anthropology, Russian Academy of Sciences, Moscow, Russia and Nuremberg University of Music, Nuremberg, Germany. It has plans to join hands with allied centres/study circles across the country for the promotion of Adivasi Studies. The CASM has also published books.

Objectives:

The students and scholars attached to the centre make extensive field-trips to the tribal-dominated villages to collect texts and artefacts which are essential for the understanding of Adivasi art, literature and worldview. The texts are documented and translated into the target languages including Bangla, Santali and English. The texts are assessed as cultural texts and analysed from a linguistic point of view. The cultural performances of the tribal communities which represent their seasonal festivals, social rites and rituals among other things are properly recorded and documented with a view to creating a state-of-the-art digital archive.

Adivasi Museum

A museum is a building used for the storing, preservation, and exhibition of objects considered to be of lasting value or interest, as objects illustrative of antiquities, natural history, fine and industrial art etc. A tribal museum is obviously a museum with a difference. It takes care of articles/artefacts that are representative of tribal art and culture. It speaks of a civilization that is very ancient, a culture that is primordial. Our country does not have many tribal museums. And our state, perhaps, has the only tribal museum which is located in the campus of Vidyasagar University. The museum conserves and

showcases various articles ranging from ornaments to musical instruments, from agricultural implements to clothes which all stand for an indigenous culture. All the items have distinct tribal names. Thus, in the exhibition hall displaying agricultural implements, we see ‘Nahel’, the plough used by the Kherwardian people, with its ‘Ishi’, ‘Patkhil’, ‘Kanba’, ‘Pawnra’, ‘Phal’ etc. In the gallery for musical instruments, among other articles, is conserved the stringed cum wind instrument called “Hotot Bhuang” which people of the Santali and Munda communities used as musical instrument to camouflage as a weapon (bow and arrow) during war with foreign invaders. Historians of music maintain that it was the first instrument of its kind in the world. In the section displaying clothes we see the tribal ‘Lugri’ which is made out of ‘Sutam’. This ‘Sutam’ is available from the plant ‘Kaskom’ the name of which is found in ancient Sanskrit literature. The museum has a wonderful collection of ornaments including ‘Hanshli’, ‘Tora’, ‘Banki’, ‘Baju’, ‘Dimbra’ etc which are used by the people of different tribal communities. The visitor to the museum will also see the household items like ‘Jonok’, ‘Hatak’, ‘Theka’, ‘Chala’ etc; cooking utensils like ‘Chelang’, ‘Tukuj’, ‘Karahi’ etc; and instruments like ‘Ruka’, ‘Renda’, ‘Korat’, ‘Tanga’ etc which all speak volumes for the day-to-day existence of the tribal people. These articles have largely been collected from the tribal-dominated villages in Orissa, West Bengal and Jharkhand. The special attraction of the museum is the rare collection of tribal patachitra(scroll painting). These paintings reflect the distinctive lifestyle and worldview of the Adivasi communities. These paintings co-exist with the Kalighat patachitra. We have thus a space for heterogeneous cultures in the museum.

1. Introduction:
